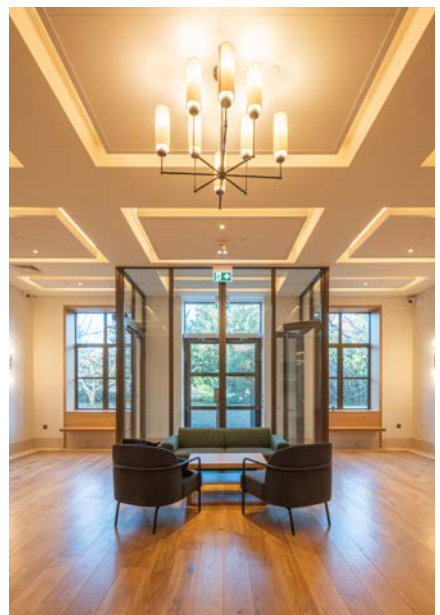

In January we began, with great excitement, to move into the new Levine Building.

More than 30 students are now enjoying the building’s residential accommodation and the majority of the college’s administrative staff have begun working from the new shared College Office. The café and the study area in the new Jack Britton Library Foyer are also open—both are proving popular places to meet and study.

Snagging and other planned works will continue over the spring and summer, with a view to the building being fully operational by the start of Michaelmas term.

To date, 1,035 Old Members, Friends and organisations have supported the project, helping to raise more than £14.6 million (97% of the fundraising target). Thank you again to everyone who has contributed. An event for donors to see the Levine Building is planned for Saturday 2 April—invitations will be sent in due course; in the meantime we hope you will make a note of the date in your diary.

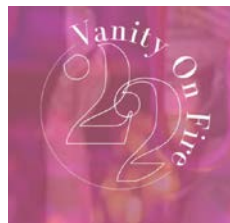
