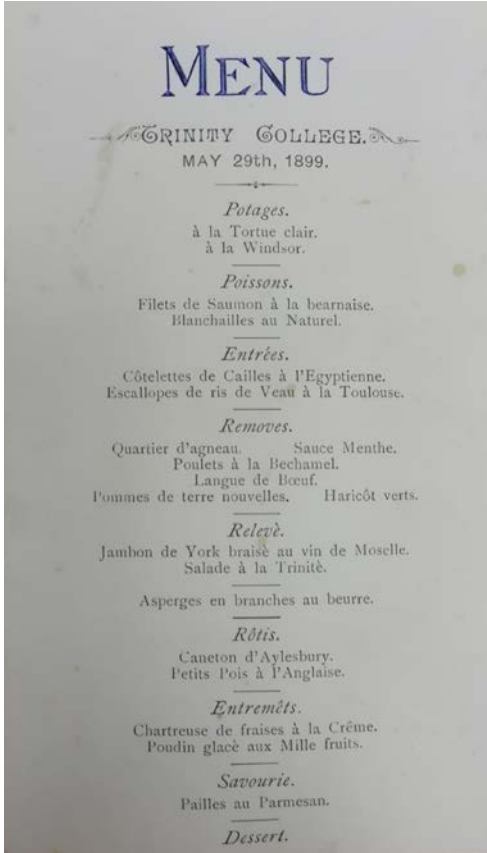
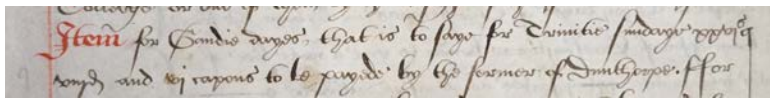
Eights Week ended with the traditional Boat Club dinner in College for all current and former members and supporters of the Boat Club.

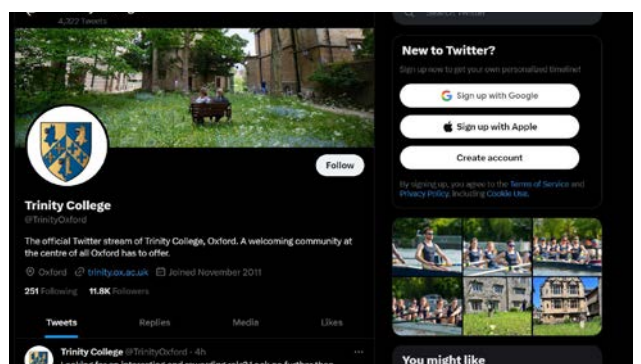
The President and Director of Development will be visiting the USA in September and holding events for Old Members and Friends on the following dates. More details will be sent out soon.
