HALL AND KITCHEN UPDATE

After the difficulties the project ran into last year, it's a relief to report that work on the Hall and kitchen is now progressing well and that the anticipated completion date is at the end of June.

Acoustic panels have been incorporated into the Hall ceiling and the painting is almost finished. The tables, which were until recently being used in the Lawns Pavilion, have now been despatched for repair and polishing in time for the re-opening of the Hall.

In January, the concrete lift shaft and parts of its steel frame were installed; this lift will give access to all floors from the Beer Cellar upwards.

Work has started on the rebuilding of the kitchen, which is one of the most significant parts of the whole scheme. The installation of kitchen equipment will mark the final phase of the project.

Once the Hall and kitchen have come back into use, the Lawns Pavilion will be dismantled and removed, the ground source heat pumps that will heat the Jackson Building will be sunk into the lawn, and then work can begin on the herbaceous border and the restoration of the garden. Read more




