OTHER SERVICES + DESCRIPTIONS

Daily Morning Prayer

Morning Prayer is said everyday and all are welcome to join. Morning Prayer is either said in Chapel or in the company of Mo (Chaplain's Dog) on outdoor walks. If interested in joining please email the Chaplain.

Choral Evensong

A special service within Oxford's traditions. The service allows listeners time for contemplation between the active day and restful night. It is free from any requirement of religious commitment, and is part of a 470-year-old choral music tradition, established around the time of the College's foundation.

Choral Eucharist

A sung service featuring The Trinity College Chapel Choir which includes Holy Communion. Often held in College during term to celebrate a special feast day in the Christian calendar. All are welcome, there is no requirement to take part in any of the service.

Choral Compline

A short service by Candlelight sung by the Choir. A peaceful and restful service at the end of the day. Port and refreshments in the Bar from 8.30pm before the service.

Roman Catholic College Mass, Tuesday 6th May, 6pm

A Catholic Mass celebrated in Trinity Chapel in association with the Oxford University Catholic Chaplaincy. Refreshments served in the Ante-chapel afterwards. All welcome.

Ascension Day Beating of the Bounds, Thursday 29th May, 9am

Ascension Day is the traditional day for the beating of Parish Boundaries. In Oxford you can join in with either the University Church of St Mary the Virgin or St Michael at the North Gate Church as they walk the parish boundaries. Check relevant websites for more details.

THIS TERM'S GUEST SPEAKERS

The Revd Canon Dr William Lamb (27th April)

Vicar of University Church

After reading Theology at Balliol, he trained for the ministry at Westcott House in Cambridge. He spent time as a curate and a parish priest in South Yorkshire, and then as the Anglican Chaplain at the University of Sheffield. In 2010 he was appointed Vice-Principal of Westcott House, Cambridge, and an Affiliated Lecturer in the Faculty of Divinity, University of Cambridge. He returned to Oxford in 2017. He is an Associate Member of the Faculty of Theology and Religion and a Supernumerary Fellow of Harris Manchester College.

Dr Rebecca Bullard (11th May)

Senior Tutor, Trinity College Oxford

After reading English Literature at Oxford, Rebecca completed her Masters at Cambridge before returning to Oxford for her DPhil. She went on to hold a Junior Research Fellowship at Merton College, Oxford and was then an Associate Professor in the Department of English Literature at the University of Reading, where she taught and researched eighteenth-century English Literature. She became Senior Tutor here in 2021.

The Right Reverend Philip Mounstephen (1st June)

Bishop of Winchester

Philip Mounstephen has been Bishop of Winchester since late 2023, and is a member of the House of Lords. Previously roles include spending five years as Bishop of Truro, leading one of the Church of England's international agencies and pastoring churches in both London and Paris. He served on the Council of the University of Gloucestershire for eight years, latterly as Vice-Chair, and chaired the Audit Committee. He lives in Winchester, with his wife, Ruth and dog, Noggin. He holds the position of being Trinity College's Visitor.

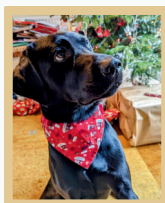
